



## Holiday Boat Inventory

Each boat comes with a complete inventory so all you will need to bring will be your clothes, towels, tea towels and groceries. It's a good idea to bring enough food to keep you going for the first few days. Also useful are soft-soled, non-slip shoes and wet weather clothing, a first aid kit and a torch for finding the boat after an evening ashore.

Depending on the size of your craft there will be the corresponding number of glasses, cutlery and crockery (for a boat sleeping a maximum of 4 people there will be 4 of these items, for an 8 berth boat there will be 8 of each).
